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

ABOUT KUALA SELANGOR


History

The origins of Kuala Selangor can be traced back to the 17th century. However, settlers have long occupied the region centuries before. This is indicated by the mentions of sub-district Jeram and even neighbouring district Klang in ancient literature such as the 14th century Nagarakretagama, 15th century Mao Kun map made during the Ming dynasty and 16th century Malay Annals. Although Kuala Selangor directly translates to "Confluence of the Selangor River", there are several folk tales that have led to the formulation of the 'Selangor' name. These include mentions of a blowfly (translates to Selangau) to mentangau trees.

After Johor won a war against Jambi (province of Indonesia) with the help of Bugis mercenaries from Sulawesi in the late 17th century, these warriors migrated and inhabited along the coast of Selangor, including Kuala Selangor. This led Selangor to be the only state in Peninsular Malaya to be founded by the Bugis. Under Raja Salehuddin, they established a powerbase by creating the Selangor Sultanate and cementing Kuala Selangor as the first old royal capital of Selangor in 1766. In 1784, Kuala Selangor was conquered by Dutch forces as they attempted to broaden their base in Malacca, Although Sultan Ibrahim managed to drive the invaders out a year later, the district was soon captured by the British before eventually returning to the hands of Selangor royalty.



POPULATION, AREA AND BORDER



In terms of neighbouring districts, it is surrounded by Sabak Bernam in the North, Hulu Selangor in the North East, Klang in the South along with Petaling and Gombak in the South East. Additionally, the Straits of Malacca is directly located in the West. Thus, this territory possesses a long sandy stretch of coastline. Other attractive terrains include palm oil plantations, paddy fields, rivers, rainforests and wetlands.



Sky Mirror

Reminiscent to the one in Bolivia's Salar de Uyuni, the Sky Mirror in Kuala Selangor's Sasaran Beach is a truly magnificent wonder. This natural phenomenon occurs during low tide under clear skies, with no evident clouds or rain, to form a HD-like reflective image. As it's located 1.74 nautical miles off the coast of Jeram (in the middle of the Straits of Malacca), you'll have to get there early via boat ride. Just be sure to wear sunscreen to protect yourself from the harsh reflective rays.

Kuala Selangor Nature Park

Malawati Hill

Involved in the war against the Dutch, the historical site of Malawati Hill is home to Malawati Fort along with the remaining cannons (including Chief Cannon). Similarly, visit the Altingsburg Lighthouse, Seven Wells, 100-Step Stairway, Hampar Stone, Kuala Selangor Historical Museum, Royal Mausoleum, Observatory Tower (Baitulhilal), Poisoned Well and the Virgin's Tomb. Blue Tears

Generated by bioluminescent phytoplankton (dinoflagellates algae), the Blue Tears phenomenon in the Kuala Selangor River is a must-see. Considering the finest clay is found near the coastline, the pottery industry has always been an important aspect of Kuala Selangor's history. Awarded the 2012 Kuala Selangor Pottery Master Craftsman title for cultural excellence, development and preservation is V.N Ramadas A/L Vengadasalam of the Ramadas Pottery Factory, also known as V.N Ramadas Pottery. Devoting almost 50 years to Indian pottery-making, he was taught the basics by his father who started the business in 1931.

After taking over, this master in pottery and ceramics implemented the knowledge and skills acquired from the Malaysian Institute of Art to improve his products. Made with rare ball clay, items include cookware, house decorations, worship statues and incense burner holders. Apart from ceramics, batu tungku (healing stone) is also sold here. Although this is a traditional artform, the practice is still kept alive and well as the older generation still uses a lot of earthenware, notably for cooking.

In recent years, modern technology has been employed to ease the preparation process. This includes electricity-powered spins, mixers and permanent kilns. In spite of these beneficial additions, the antique equipment is still maintained for visitors. In fact, the workshop still operates in a modest yet spacious hut along Jalan Kelang. It is divided into three areas: front for throwing and teaching, adjoining for kiln and firewood and rear for casting and drying.

Nowadays, the business is managed by his master potter son, Velavar. Therefore, do not be shocked to find out that the store is also referred to as Velavar Pottery. Live demonstrations, 2-hour learning courses and student interview opportunities are available here to tourists and locals alike. Overall, the Ramadas name is renowned in Selangor and stands as one of the last traditional potteries remaining in Kuala Selangor, out of the estimated original 50. Book an appointment or feel free to walk-in to experience the fun.





Masjid Jamek Sultan Ibrahim

Erected in 1982, Masjid Jamek Sultan Ibrahim was named after Sultan Ibrahim Shah, the late ruler of 18th century Selangor. Standing at an estimated 40ft with space to accommodate about 2,000 congregants, it has four golden domes, two minarets and walls etched with inscriptions from the Ouran.

Kampung Kuantan Firefly Sanctuary

One of the three locations in Kuala Selangor to observe the enchanting fireflies is the Kampung Kuantan Firefly Park. Currently managed and developed by the Kuala Selangor Municipal Council, this eco-venture was initially capitalised during the 1970s by a local businessman. Enveloped by acres of coconut and palm trees, take a sampan (non-motorised, wooden boat) ride along the winding Sungai Selangor River to carefully get closer to the mangrove swamps housing these flickering creatures.

With the Pteroptyx tener species as the dominant type available in this region, the males emit a brighter light than the females to attract them. Therefore, enjoy maximum visibility by heading over just after 8:00pm on a cloudless, moonless night when they are most likely still active. With an estimated RM60.00 sampan (Malaysian) and RM100.00 per sampan (Foreigner), the total boat journey is about 20 minutes. Keep in mind that mosquito repellent is recommended while flash photography is not to avoid disruption.

INTRODUCTION TO PASIR PENAMBANG



none other than Pasir Penambang. After all, it is a simple yet charming fishing district located right next to the Straits of Melaka. Based in the northern area of the seaside region of Selangor, it can take about an hour (or around 80 km) to drive from Kuala Lumpur. In terms of the population, the Hokkien-speaking Chinese community stands as the majority of this sub-district.

Bagan Sungai Yu is known as the central fishing village, so you can be sure to observe a series of boats parked at the jetty. It also constitutes the main population centre in the sector. Regarding the history, this little village was founded by Indonesian Chinese who escaped from Panipahan, Indonesia during the 1940s Japanese occupation. As seafood is the highlight here, it goes without saying that fishing and merchandising or trading in marine products is the leading sector of employment.

On a related note, the gastronomic scene in Pasir Penambang has flourished. This has led to its proud reputation as one of the top seafood areas to visit in Selangor. Ergo, expect to find many seafood restaurants here -- especially along the shoreline of the Selangor River. Furthermore, many have travelled from near and far to taste the many different types of fresh catches, together with the dried or preserved marine products available. From juicy crabs to enormous fishes, seafood lovers will be delighted to dine at any of these establishments. Aside from the product itself, these restaurants offer a variety of cooking styles too.

Additionally, there are various dehydrated anchovies left in the open, along with other dried goods. Pasir Penambang Wet Market

As the term 'wet market' (translated to pasir basah) implies, many flock here from miles away to purchase freshly caught seafood. Supplied directly from the fishing boats of a nearby fishing village, expect to find endless rows of various fish, prawns, mussels, squid and other raw aquatic goods. In fact, this main market sells grade one level freshness as the items are sold less than six hours after they were caught from the Straits of Melaka.


Homestay Sungai Sireh

Have you ever experienced a traditional 'kampung' lifestyle? At Agrotourism Homestay Sungai Sireh, you most certainly can. This quaint homestay is actually located in an agricultural village. Along with several other kampung homes, it is encompassed by a clear, serene panoramic view of flourishing green rice fields. This landscape is also accompanied by flowing rivers and lush jungles.

Although you can certainly embark on a day-trip, try spending a few nights with a foster family to authentically experience the village. Enjoy living in a traditional kampung house made from hand-cut tree logs. Please make your selection from the four accommodation packages available -- they differ according to the number of days and nights spent. If you will be residing for at least two days, three meals per day are included in the expenses. Some of the facilities include a canteen, surau, parking space and a multipurpose hall.

Upon your visit, you will learn about traditional paddy planting, tree logging techniques and herbal plants with the old agricultural machinery on display. Regarding the more interactive activities, there is undoubtedly an abundant variation of them in store. However, they depend on the type of package chosen. Taking place across different geographical landscapes, they combine several aspects of a village lifestyle: kayaking, jungle trekking, paddy planting, fishing (with a bamboo rod), catfish stirring (with bare hands), bathing in the trough, cooking authentic Malay dishes and taking tractor rides throughout the village. During the harvest season, you can even witness the paddy workers processing the rice. In terms of the arts, join in the batik colouring session and watch the different types of traditional Malay dances (kuda kepang, cempuling and ghazal) performed by the residents. Feel free to also taste the multitude of diverse fruits produced here, along with the fresh young coconut water served. Overall, this is a fantastic location to fully immerse yourself in the daily life of a traditional Malay villager.

Selangor Fruit Valley


Encompassing a seemingly boundless plot of land, the Selangor Fruit Valley is a gorgeous plantation that makes for an ideal escapade. It was developed by Perbadanan Kemajuan Pertanian Selangor with the ambition to educate visitors on agricultural life through interactive experiences and offer first-hand taste of fresh produce cultivated and sold by local farmers. From popular choices such as jackfruit and durian to underrated ones like passion fruit and guava, there are more than 20 types of tropical fruit planted all over the area. Do stop by their fruit store set up outside near the main entrance before you leave.

Although the majority of this farm is clearly dedicated to local fruits, there are several sections allotted to other aspects of the agricultural scene. These are some of the attractions available: herb and spice garden, orchid garden, vegetable plot, stingless honey bee farm, rubber plantation, nursery biotech lab, three-storey observation tower, courtyard and lake. In turn, a vast array of entertaining outdoor activities such as paddle boating, cycling and camping is made possible.

On top of that, there is a petting zoo filled with farm animals such as rabbits, deers, hedgehogs, ducks and goats. For extra fun (and comfort), take a mono tram or tractor ride to visit each section of the valley. Moreover, the Rimbun Cafe is also located within these grounds. Pop by for breakfast or lunch for helpings of local delicacies such as asam pedas, tempoyak and ulam. While admission fees range from RM10 to RM25 depending on nationality and age, check out their farm visit packages



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
